A Prize in honor of Arrigo Recordati

The International Prize for Scientific Research was established in 2000 in memory of the Italian pharmaceutical entrepreneur Arrigo Recordati to perpetuate his legacy and to inspire biomedical discoveries benefiting people worldwide.

A growing commitment to the treatment of rare diseases

Over the last fifteen years Recordati has made the Rare Diseases field a health priority and increased its commitment worldwide through its dedicated subsidiary Recordati Rare Diseases. The primary focus of Recordati Rare Diseases has been to research, develop, and market drugs for the treatment of metabolic genetic disorders. Recently, this portfolio has been enhanced with additional innovative products in the area of rare endocrine diseases.

To reflect its commitment in endocrinology, Recordati decided that the 2022 Edition of The International Prize for Scientific Research Arrigo Recordati will be dedicated to **the promotion and recognition of excellence in research in the area of rare endocrine diseases**.

The winning project will receive a €100,000 research grant

The 2022 Award will be given to an outstanding, novel, basic, translational, or clinical research project focusing on pituitary disorders. Young investigators of all nationalities working in the area of pituitary disorders are eligible to apply.

Young investigators are typically junior faculty who are not more than ten years from completing their postdoctoral fellowship or clinical specialty and who are not in any way directly affiliated with pharmaceutical companies.
